



Claude Hurtubise founded his publishing house in 1960, on the eve of the Quiet Revolution. By the 1980s, it had begun producing content for children and worked to promote new literary voices including those of Michel Noël, Andrée-Paule Mignot, Laurent Chabin, and many more.

Today, Groupe HMH represents four publishing houses (XYZ, MultiMondes, MD, and Hurtubise) along with a distribution structure to publish 140 – 150 titles annually, including works of fiction and nonfiction, children's literature, books for general audiences, and educational resources. The Groupe also co-owns Bibliothèque québécoise, a publisher that specializes in re-publishing classic and contemporary Quebec literature in paperback.

Groupe HMH maintains a vast literary scope out of a desire to create opportunity and think outside the box. It has cultivated an international presence over the past several decades by participating in major book fairs and trade missions. The Groupe is also a visionary on several fronts including the audio book industry, for which it now produces content. Today, HMH is recognized as a leader in the French-Canadian publishing market.

For the seventh year in a row, Hurtubise will open the season with the popular *Juliette* series that has sold over 600,000 copies. In this 14th volume, author Rose-Line Brasset takes readers on an adventure to Mexico. Sophie Rondeau is also back with the second volume of the *Adèle et compagnie* series, featuring a twelve-year-old struggling with dyslexia and dysorthographia who discovers she has three biological sisters she never knew about. Sports novels are one of the publisher's most popular youth genres. Following the success of François Bérubé's previous series on soccer and hockey, each with over 30,000 copies sold, he is back with *Planète Snowboard*, a novel dedicated to winter sports.

This season, XYZ is delighted to welcome Montreal mayor Valérie Plante to its team, whose debut graphic novel *Simone Simoneau* underscores the importance of citizen engagement in politics and will be published simultaneously in English by D+Q. The book features magnificent illustrations by Delphie Côté-Lacroix, who received a 2019 Governor General's Award for *Jack et le temps perdu*, available in English from Greystone Books in October 2020.

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INTERNATIONAL TRANSLATION GRANTS

CANADA COUNCIL FOR THE ARTS

The "translation" component of Arts Abroad funds the translation of Canadian dramatic works or literary works for international presentation or publication.

Types of writing covered by the funding

Translation funding is available for fiction and short stories, poetry, drama, graphic novels, children's and YA literature, and literary non-fiction.

Amount of funding

Up to 50% of translation costs and a maximum of CA\$20,000 for each translation. Each applicant is eligible to receive up to two translation grants per year. Costs are calculated based on translation fees.

SODEC provides financial assistance for the translation of literary works written by Québec authors and published by Québec publishers. This program aims at providing visibility for Québec authors and literature throughout exportation and international rights markets.


Amount of funding

The request for funds must be submitted to SODEC by a Québec publisher. The subsidy granted may be up to 75% of the translator's fee and up to a total amount of CA\$12,500.

Simone Simoneau combines the real-life experiences of Valérie Plante, mayor of Montreal, with the talents of Delphie Côté-Lacroix, award-winning illustrator. This playful, personal interpretation of Simone's foray into politics tells the story of one woman who decides to follow her instincts in spite of the political machinery working against her.

VALÉRIE PLANTE worked in the community and cultural sectors before becoming a leading figure in Quebec politics. She made history in 2017 by becoming the first woman to be elected Mayor of Montreal. Her story comes to life through Simone Simoneau, whose ups and downs are a testament to anyone aspiring to do things a little differently.

DELPHIE CÔTÉ-LACROIX fell in love with illustration while studying graphic design and continued her artistic exploration at Concordia. In 2019, she won a GG Literary Award for her illustrations of *How Jack Lost Time*, in collaboration with Stéphanie Lapointe. Through comics, Delphie has found an ideal vehicle to demystify the political world and make Valérie's inspiring journey accessible.

MY BODY IN PIECES

La grosse laide Marie-Noëlle Hébert

A deeply emotional graphic memoir of a young woman's struggles with self-esteem and body image issues.

All Marie-Noëlle wants is to be thin and beautiful. She wishes that her thighs were slimmer, that her stomach lay flatter. Maybe then her parents wouldn't make fun of her eating habits at family dinners, the girls at school wouldn't call her ugly, and the boy she likes would ask her out. This all-too-relatable memoir follows Marie-Noëlle from childhood to her twenties, as she navigates what it means to be born into a body that doesn't fall within society's beauty standards.

When, as a young teen, Marie-Noëlle begins a fitness regime in an effort to change her body, her obsession with her weight and size only grows and she begins having suicidal thoughts. Fortunately for Marie-Noëlle, a friend points her in the direction of therapy, and slowly, she begins to realize that she doesn't need the approval of others to feel whole.

MARIE-NOËLLE HÉBERT lives in Montreal. Largely self-taught, she studied advertising illustration at Collège Salette. She did a series of illustrations for the documentary *Carricks, dans le sillage des Irlandais* by Viveka Melki (Tortuga films, 2017) and illustrated the children's book *Le voyage de Kalak* (Cuento de luz, 2018). *My Body In Pieces* is her first graphic novel.



Marie-Noëlle Hébert's debut graphic memoir is visually stunning and drawn entirely in graphite pencil, depicting a deeply personal and emotional journey that encourages us all to embrace the bodies we are born into.
